Adam J. Hodnichak has been hired as the new executive director of The Union County Foundation, succeeding long-time leader, David A. Vollrath, who will retire from the post in April after more than 20 years.

Hodnichak was selected by the Foundation’s board of directors after an extensive search and screening process, said Roger C. Nicol, board chair. A 2007 graduate of Marysville High School, Hodnichak holds a bachelor’s degree in business marketing from Saint Vincent College, Latrobe, PA. He is currently a Certified Financial Planner with McCarthy & Cox Retirement and Estate Specialists.

“We believe Adam’s background in business and finance, along with his knowledge of the community, make him an excellent fit for this versatile and demanding role,” Nicol said. “He has a true passion for the vision of the Foundation: to enhance the quality of life for the citizens of Union County.”

Nicol called the Foundation’s growth under Vollrath’s leadership “truly remarkable,” noting that the organization’s assets rose from \$1.6 million in 2001 at the start of his tenure to nearly \$20 million today.

“Even more important, UCF has distributed more than \$13,117,805 over the past two decades to support charitable causes in and around Union County, including a record \$1,428,227 last year,” Nicol added. He said that, in addition to marking its 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 2022, the Foundation would recognize Vollrath for his outstanding service at the UCF annual celebration in September.

“We’re excited to welcome our new staff leader in April but owe Dave a tremendous thanks for positioning The Union County Foundation so well,” Nicol said, noting that Hodnichak would start on April 4 so he could work with Vollrath for a month before he retires.
